Dear SJA Families,

Congratulations to our 5th, 7th and 8th grade girls who participated in the Egg Drop Challenge on Saturday, February 18. The 5th grade team was recognized for the "most creative design." On Tuesday, February 21, a team of 7th grade boys competed in the Tower of Power STEM Challenge.

We are so proud of our students and how they demonstrate their STEM skills. Our small school is certainly letting the community know that we are SJA Strong!

Thank you again for helping and being flexible during drop off and pick up. We will need to continue this for at least the next 2 weeks. This is an inconvenience for our neighbors on Edmund Street, so please be patient and kind. As you line up on Edmund Street, enter from Market Street towards Plater Street. bBe sure to stay on the right side of the street and have your flashers on if sitting still and your blinker on if you are ready to turn. It is our goal to keep everyone safe.

Although we have not seen snow yet, please be sure your student is dressed appropriately for the weather. Coats, hats and gloves are recommended. St. Joan of Arc follows the same procedures for closing and delays as Harford County Public School Systems. If there is a delay, regardless of the amount of time, there is **NO** Before Care. In the event that we close early, After Care is open for 2 hours after school closing. If schools are closed, there is **NO** Extended Care.

Today, Ash Wednesday, we begin the Lenten season, a 40-day season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, ending at sundown on Holy Thursday. As one form of almsgiving, students brought home a collection box and information about the Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl Program. 
Week 8 - CREATIVE CHEFS SWEET TREATS - July 31 - August 4, Camp Cost \$300
