Dear SJA Parents and Families.

We are speeding toward our Easter break. I hope your family is planning to enjoy all of the beautiful Holy Week liturgies, beginning with Palm Sunday this week. The school was buzzing with excitement this morning as all of our students were preparing for field trips either to the Maryland Science Center or the Baltimore Museum of Industry.

Middle school students brought home a letter explaining a mental health awareness program we are hosting next Tuesday. The Power of Expression. Nurse Baer says...

Flu and "Flu Like Illness' Outbreak!

While our cases of Flu B and "Flu Like Illness are decreasing, we are still seeing 1-3 new cases a day. We are cleaning the classrooms thoroughly each day and trying to limit students being out of their homerooms as much as possible. Symptoms have included fever, cough, headaches, body aches, stomach complaints such as diarrhea and vomiting along sore throats. Students who have become ill at school with ILI have been evaluated and sent home as appropriate. At this point, we have seen this illness in all of our classes.

If your child exhibits any of these symptoms, please consider keeping them home and see how they are. Please have them remain at home until they are symptom free without medication.

We need everyone working together to help limit the spread!

If your child is sent home sick from the nurse, THEY MUST STAY HOME THE ENTIRE NEXT DAY OF SCHOOL.

If your child is staying home for any reason, please include the nurse in your email to their teacher(s). (<u>sbaer@stjoanarc.org</u>) Please include their symptoms including temperature reading and any positive lab tests. I am doing daily symptoms/flu reporting to the Harford County Health Department and following their guidelines as much as possible.


