Something we are focusing on this month is helping students learn how to self-advocate —speaking up respectfully when they need support or are feeling uncomfortable. Self-advocacy looks different at every age. For our young students, it might mean saying, "I need a break" or "Can I get some water?" For our older students, it can sound like "I'm feeling frustrated and need a minute to regroup, or using an "I" statement, such as "I feel upset when I'm interrupted because it makes it hard for me to focus". When we teach children to use their voices calmly and clearly, we are helping them build confidence, emotional awareness, and problem-solving skills they'll carry for life. –Ms. B
