

## Tuition for the 26-27 school year

The School Board has approved the tuition for the 26-27 year.



### St. Joan of Arc School

*Grounded in Faith, Focused on the Future*

Dear Families,

The budget has been developed and tuition has been set for the 2026–2027 school year. This year's tuition will reflect an increase of **\$270.00**, approximately **3.02%**. We understand the impact that tuition changes can have on families. While we have maintained a tuition freeze for the past two years, an increase is now necessary to sustain the high standard of education we provide and to support fair compensation for our faculty.

To continue recruiting and retaining highly qualified educators, we are working toward achieving compensation at 80% of the rate for Baltimore County teachers. We remain deeply grateful to our dedicated faculty for their commitment to Catholic education.

#### **Discounts and Fees**

##### Catholic Tuition Discount

The Catholic Tuition Discount Form must be submitted each year to qualify for the \$1,000 per child Catholic Discount.

##### Multi-Child Discount

- 2 children total discount \$500
- 3 children total discount \$1,250
- 4 children total discount \$2,250
- 5 children total discount \$3,500

##### 8th Grade Fee

\$200 - Due April 17, 2026 ( Includes the yearbook, retreat, and graduation fees)

##### Application and Registration Fees per Student (Non Refundable)

###### New Students

- Application Fee: \$99
- Registration Fee: \$175

###### Returning Students

- Re-registration Fee: \$200 each year
- **EARLY BIRD: \$150 if re-registered by January 10, 2026**

##### NEW: Tuition Deposit (Non-Refundable)

**Each family will be responsible for a \$500 deposit, which will be applied to their 2026–2027 tuition. You may elect to pay the deposit in full or make payments toward the deposit through April 24, 2026.**

##### FACTS Tuition Management & Financial Aid

FACTS will continue as the Archdiocese of Baltimore's provider for tuition management and financial aid processing. FACTS will collect all tuition payments—whether paid in full, semi-annually, or monthly.

All families are required to enroll in FACTS and make payments through EFT (automatic bank withdrawal) or credit card.

### Nurse's Notes.....

Cold and Flu Season is upon us. We are currently experiencing an outbreak of both Flu and Flu like symptoms. It has hit some grades harder than others, but every class has been affected. The symptoms range from:

- nasal congestion,
- fever
- sore throat
- cough,
- extreme fatigue.
- body aches,
- cough
- headaches, many severe
- nausea with and without vomiting
- and cases of pneumonia

If your child presents with any of these symptoms, please keep them home until they are symptom free for 48 hours per our guidance for the Harford County Health Department. That is the only way we can limit the spread of this illness. Please know that it can last up to 10 days with a persistent, lingering cough. If taken early enough, Tamiflu has been helpful in controlling symptoms.

Please be sure to email '[attendance@stjoanarc.org](mailto:attendance@stjoanarc.org)' or '[sbaer@stjoanarc.org](mailto:sbaer@stjoanarc.org)' with the reason why your child is absent along with their symptoms. This information is pertinent to the report we must send the Health Department. Your help is greatly appreciated.
